The Lead Trustee for Safeguarding would assist the board to set the right culture by championing safeguarding throughout the organisation; consider our strategic plans and make sure they reflect safeguarding legislation and regulations; ensure effective policy and procedures are in place; and help share information about learning and new developments.

The Lead Trustee for Safeguarding will be well supported by our Chair and strong cohesive board of trustees to provide leadership, direction and support to our senior management (CEO and 3 senior managers). In addition, we draw support and contribute to transforming mental health provision through our unrivalled networks through our National Mind body and partners in Mind in London.
